**Paweł Antkowiak, Ph.D.** – assistant professor in the Department of Research on Local Government and Self-Government at Adam Mickiewicz University in Poznań. He was awarded a grant by the Adam Mickiewicz Foundation in Poznań. His academic interests encompass the functioning of local government, professional and business self-governments, EU regional policy and the impact of new technologies on democratic processes.
